Introduction to Montessori Education

For more than a century, the Montessori educational method, based on the work of Dr. Maria Montessori, has been respected worldwide. Dr. Montessori recognized the child's developmental need for individualized, sequenced learning and a carefully prepared environment that allows for active child choice and small-group lessons. Through careful observation of children, she created an educational approach based on children's natural progression of learning, inquiry, and development. Teachers of the Montessori approach undergo very specific education and training to facilitate the unique educational experience. Montessori teachers are careful observers and creators, mentors as well as supportive companions to the children in their care. They adapt classroom experiences to match each child's readiness and developmental needs.

In a Bright Horizons Montessori School:

- Children are viewed as competent learners in uniquely prepared Montessori environments. They are motivated to make choices that lead to mastery of their bodies, their minds, and their environment. Children in mixed-age groups respond to their natural drive to work and learn, as well as to teach other children and act as role models for learning.
- Montessori-designed, self-correcting educational materials and teacher-developed activities encourage children's exploration of the world through their senses, movement, and motor mastery. Children develop concentration, observation, and assessment skills. The child's ability to complete a sequence of activity from beginning, middle, to end lays the foundation for higher levels of learning.
- Teachers observe and guide each child through the curriculum by introducing concepts and materials in small-group lessons, encouraging practice and refinement through repetition, and introducing new challenges when the child is ready. The Montessori-trained teacher is both guide and observer, as well as a nurturing companion to the children. As children progress at their own pace and rhythm, new lessons are presented. And as children grow, they use the materials to explore ideas in new and deeper ways.
- Activities encourage independence and freedom within appropriate limits creating a small society of capable, independent learners working together.
- Children develop an understanding of the relationship between knowledge and people. Each child is respected as a unique personality and as an important, responsible member of the community.

Infant and Toddler Program

(6 weeks to 3 years)

In the Montessori infant and toddler program, each child is nurtured as a unique individual. The beautiful and orderly space provides gentle support for active learning. The infant and toddler program blends practical life, manipulative play, sensorial experiences, math, language, art, and music.

Infants and toddlers are encouraged to explore in a rich, safe learning environment with materials from the natural world, everyday household objects, and materials chosen for their design and sensory qualities. Freedom of movement is valued, and babies have opportunities to use all of their emerging physical and cognitive skills.

Infant and toddler teachers form close relationships with families and nurture the development of each child, based on observation of his or her unique characteristics. Through responsive interactions, teachers promote the development of language and establish a strong sense of security.



Primary Program

(3 to 6 years)

In this mixed-age primary classroom, the Montessori hands-on learning approach includes the major curriculum areas: language, mathematics, sensorial, practical life, cultural studies, science, geography, history, music, and art.

The primary program fosters autonomy in children by instilling an "I can do it" attitude, which gives the child a good feeling about school and builds independence.

We ensure that each building block of the academic foundation is mastered by the child. Using careful observation, the teacher takes her cues from the child to determine when formal reading and math instruction should begin and when to move on to the next skill.

Elementary Program

(1st through 5th grade)

The Montessori elementary program focuses on decision-making, problem-solving, and time management within the context of academics. Mathematics, geometry, science, language arts, history, and geography form the core curriculum.

A Montessori elementary education draws upon the independence of the student, encouraging self-directed study and independent research while developing skills and knowledge through individual instruction and small-group lessons. Students learn abstract concepts by working with concrete material. The program meets or exceeds all state standards.

Montessori logic dictates a learning sequence that begins with global concepts and builds toward specific details. For example, a student will move from the study of the globe to the study of the continents or from the study of the decimal system to the study of the different mathematical operations.

Teachers combine high expectations for children with hands-on, challenging, and engaging materials in an environment designed to foster academic and social skills.
